PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

NDSS has had a smooth start to our second semester. We will be distributing report cards through homerooms on Thursday, February 9th. This will be the final report card for our grade 8 and 9 students that will be in the traditional format. We will be utilizing the new district format for our second semester report cards. These new reporting procedures will put more of an emphasis on ongoing reporting, authentic assessment, and student involvement in their assessment. It will also see an end to the traditional percentages and letter grades for reporting on student progress. Parents of grade 8 and 9 students should have noticed a new course outline format for our second semester courses with the following format:

Students will be self-assessing their progress on rubrics based on this language and teachers will be creating new activities as well as re-structuring tried and true practice to align with this language. This is a process that will be evolving throughout the semester and well into next year. Students at the 8 and 9 level will be involved in student learning showcases, so please stay tuned for more information. Our Grade 10-12 Students will continue on the current reporting pattern with the same format of reporting that was used in semester one. Course selection will be happening this week, Thursday, February 9th and Friday, February 10th. Students will complete course selection with their counsellors during class time, but they will bring home a second course selection sheet for further discussion with parents. The Course selection booklets will be available on our website by the end of the week. We are happy to announce that some of the new BC Curriculum will be offered in our course calendars, and these courses will be offered if enough students show an interest.




YEARBOOKS





YOUTH SERVICES—ISLAND HEALTH


The NDSS Youth Services will be Thursday afternoons from 12-3:30 p.m. twice a month. Island Health will provide both a public health nurse and a family doctor on the following dates:

February 9, 2017 February 16, 2017 March 2, 2017 March 16, 2017 April 6, 2017 April 20, 2017 May 11, 2017 May 25, 2017 June 8, 2017 June 22, 2017



The centre will offer health services by either drop-in or appointments and is open to all students of NDSS School. The centre is located next to the counselling office. Services include low cost birth control and emergency contraception; free pregnancy testing; STI testing and screening; immunizations; and referrals to child youth mental health and addiction services. Physicians will see students for any health/wellness related matters including referrals for x-ray, blood work and mental health support.

Essentially, the students can see a doctor for any reason just as they would in the community at a walk-in clinic. The Youth Centre is intended to allow low barrier services and convenient access for our youth population. Students are welcome to come in with any health related questions or concerns and will be treated with respect and be given outstanding care by our staff. All services are confidential. The centre is closed during regular school breaks such as Winter Break and Spring Break and professional development days.
