10:00am-11:30am or 12:00-2:00pm.



Grades 9-10: Wednesday, June 17 or Thursday, June 18

PERSONAL EDUCATION NUMBER (PEN)

Your PEN number is important! This number is your link to your education records. Make certain this number is recorded somewhere safe, as you will need it to order transcripts from the BC Ministry of Education for years to come, or in order to upgrade your education.

STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE (STS) HAVE YOU CREATED YOUR ACCOUNT?

June 2019 was the first year that the Ministry of Education did not mail graduates an original transcript for their records upon graduation. Instead, they are encouraging students to create an account and access the Student Transcript Service.

Transcripts will be available for students to print or send on the StudentTranscripts Service. Students are encouraged to create an STS account prior to the release of assessment or exam results.

You can use StudentTranscript Service (STS) to:

- View or order your secondary school transcript
- Send your secondary school transcripts to post-secondary institutions
- Order your graduation certificate
- View your scholarships
- View your provincial exam or graduation assessment results.

DID YOU KNOW? STS FREE TRANSCRIPTS

Through STS, current students in Grade 12 or on the Adult Graduation Program can send up to 25 free transcripts to post-secondary institutions for up to six months after they graduate. After that time, past graduates may access additional copies of their transcripts via this service for a fee of \$10 per copy.

Students are also entitled to one free transcript after graduation that can be sent to any address. This transcript is not mailed automatically at the end of the school year but, if desired, must be ordered by the student on STS.

GRADS, DO WE HAVE YOUR CURRENT MAILING ADDRESS?

Your home address is where the Ministry of Education will send important correspondence. Make sure your address on file is correct!

ENSURE YOUR STUDENT HAS A SEAT ON THE BUS IN SEPTEMBER! You must register online EVERY YEAR.

All Nanaimo Ladysmith Public School (NLPS) bus riders will require a 2020-2021 Z-Pass to ride the bus. Students must produce and scan their pass daily upon entry and exit of the bus for both morning and afternoon routes. Bus passes will be printed and issued once registration has been received and distributed at the school indicated on the registration in September.

Registrations are used to determine bus routes.



School Registration 2020-2021

To register your child in Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools, the online, centralized registration will begin on **January 8, 2020 at 8 a.m.** Pacific Standard Time. The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you.

Take a moment and ask yourself the following questions:

1. Is my child new to Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools?
 2. Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2020 that will be entering Kindergarten? **Applications must be received by June 15, 2020 to ensure a placement in your child's catchment-area school.**
 3. Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?
 4. Do I want to register my child in Early French Immersion? **Applications will be received until January 31, 2020, at which time student selection will be determined by lottery. Parents will be notified in early February 2020. Late French Immersion Students are placed as space permits.**
 5. Do I want to register my child in secondary academies?

- Applications will be received until March 1, 2020, at which time student selection will be determined either by lottery or tryout/audition. Parents will be notified in May 2020.**
6. Do I want to apply for a school transfer request (out-of-catchment)? **Applications are due March 31, 2020.**

Dear Parents/Caregivers of Students in Grade 5,

Bonjour! Have you ever wished your child were fluent in both official languages? Over half a million Canadians have achieved functional bilingualism through French Immersion. In our school district, one student in 10 is enrolled in French Immersion and will graduate ready to pursue a bilingual career or post-secondary studies in French.



Over the past 40 years, thousands of students in our district have had great success in Early French Immersion (EFI), which starts in Kindergarten or Grade 1.

If your child is entering Grade 6 in September 2020, they are eligible to enroll in Late French Immersion (LFI) and join those graduating from secondary school with bilingual Dogwood certificates. LFI is a fully funded, 2-year public education program with no additional costs.

Please discuss the LFI option with your child and with other parents. Pending sufficient enrolment, LFI will continue this September at École Quarterway Elementary School (www.quarterway.ca). Ideally there will be a class of 29 new Grade 6 students.
