RAPID COVID TESTS

- Yesterday afternoon students were called to the cafeteria by grade and were given 5 rapid covid tests to take home.
- If your teen(s) was absent on March 8th there will be other opportunities between today and Friday to receive their tests.

DUAL DOGWOOD UPDATE

- For the last few years, NDSS has required that students in our NLPS immersion program take Math 10 & 11 in French.
- BC Ministry Certificate of Graduation requirements for a <u>French Immersion Dual Dogwood</u> don't necessitate that school districts offer Math 10 & 11 in French as part of mandatory courses students must take in French for diploma credits.
- Requiring NDSS French Immersion (F.I.) students take *Mathématiques 10 et 11* has created challenges when our bilingual learners transition to Math 12 which is offered in English only. F.I. students and staff have expressed concern about this.
- In 2022/2023 NDSS will no longer offer Math 10 & 11 in French. Other senior F.I. courses offerings meet the credits required for a dual dogwood and our counsellors will work with our Gr. 9 & 10 F.I. students to reselect Math courses for next year.

NLPS SPORTS ACADEMIES

- By Fri March 11th, families who applied to one of our Sports Academies at NDSS will be notified if they received a spot. Available spaces for new Academy students are determined by lottery and only those who got a spot will be contacted.
- Families who applied for an Academy spot, but were not successful in the March 1st initial lottery, are put on a waitlist and contacted if a space becomes available in the coming months. Email Academy questions to: academiesndss@sd68.bc.ca

STUDENT SAFETY AT BUS STOP

- Some NDSS student who take city transit home are engaging in unsafe & impulsive behaviors which put themselves, and others, at risk of physical harm as they wait for the bus. Specifically, some crowd and/or push each other onto the street.
- Our NDSS Safety Committee is working with the City of Nanaimo Transit Operations Department to find a long-term solution to reduce the surges of students as they congregate at the bus stops/shelter across the street on Wakesiah after school.
- The original plan to divide the boarding location into three separate spots has worked to a degree, but not enough.
- The next step is to alter the bus stop format to reduce "bunching". The City Transportation Department anticipates implementation over the next couple weeks (*likely over spring break*), but the specific formant has yet to be finalized.
- Until these next changes occur, there will continue to be an acute risk of vehicular contact from vehicles when awaiting youth are surging/bunching/jostling and may be pushed in the street. Students must space out and wait calmly for the bus.

OTHER INFORMATION

- Did you know that the sunflower is Ukraine's national flower? To help support those affected by the War in Ukraine, our Student Council is raising funds for the Red Cross by selling sunflower seeds in front of the main office this week.
- This Friday, March 11th, is the last day of classes prior to our 2-week spring break. Classes resume at 8:30am on Mar 28th.
