Enjoy 6 weeks of online, self-paced training, which focuses on key personal employability skills such as Communication, Collaboration, Digital Skills, Creativity and more. You'll also gain Job Search skills and tools including Resumes, Cover Letters and Interview know-hows, all with support from our team. The 6-week online training portion is followed by 12 weeks of one-on-one assistance as you look for employment or focus on education.

Eligibility requirements

- Ages 16-29 at the time of intake
- Living in communities from South to Central Vancouver Island
- Unemployed, employed part-time or precariously employed
- Legally entitled to work in Canada
- Not currently participating in another provincial government-funded employment program.
- Ready, willing and able to work
- We pay \$300 per week up to 6 weeks based on active participation!
