2024 Summer Problem Solving Course (uwaterloo.ca)

Online Summer Problem Solving Course: Designed for high school students who have completed at least Grade 11 university stream mathematics, this unique summer course is self-paced and is particularly useful for students who are considering studying one of the following disciplines at university: mathematics, computer science, engineering, or the physical sciences.
